FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Can we bring our family pet to include in the photos?

A. We absolutely love to include pets in your photos! Please just check with your host organisation that they're happy to have pets on site. But it is totally fine with us! Dogs are welcome at The Spit and Pizzey Park shoot locations. Please be aware other dogs and children will be using the area.

Q. How many people can we include in our session?

A. Our studio set will comfortably accommodate up to 10 adults or around 15 people with a combination of small children and adults. It will be squishy though! If you have a larger family, we recommend emailing <u>admin@borderstudios.com.au</u> and we can discuss options for you.

Q. How long will my photos take to be ready?

A. Galleries will be ready for viewing usually within 48 hours of your session. You will then have 2 weeks to place your order. Once your photos have been ordered and paid for, digital files will be available immediately, and prints or canvases will take about 2 weeks to arrive.

WHAT TO WEAR

First and foremost, we suggest planning clothes that you're comfortable and relatively free to move in. Do a Google image search for "Family Portrait outfits", and see what you like! Our studio backdrop is a warm, grey, textured design, and we find it looks good with most colours. Check our example photos for backgrounds for beach and park locations.

Also, think about how you intend to display your portraits, and what colours will look best for that. Finally, lay out everyone's clothes in one place and make sure they all work together.

What photographs well: Textures (think knit, corduroy, denim, linen etc), earth tones and jewel tones.
What to avoid: Clothes that are too big or too small, visible bra straps, any straps that fall off the shoulders when sitting down, overalls for babies, very short skirts or shorts.

WHO TO BRING

Think about who you would like to be in your photos? Grandparents? Aunts, uncles and cousins? Pets? Keep in mind that more people may mean less variety in your gallery as larger groups will take a little bit longer to pose and photograph. However, 6-8 people is very manageable with a variety of images.

HOW TO PREPARE

Think about the purpose of your photos. Are they just for yourself? Or do you plan to use them for gifts too? Have you had family portraits before? Do you want to match your photos or poses to previous sessions? Or do you want to do something completely different? Feel free to take photos on your phone of your portraits at home to show our photographers so we can do our best to accommodate any special requests.

Some families also find it helps to make a list of all the different images you want (eg, Everyone together, Grandparents with kids, parents with kids, just the kids, just grandparents, just parents, individual photos of each child etc) so you can make sure we don't miss anything on the day.
